Parent Top Tip

Understanding the World

We are learning to talk about the weather and how the trees and plants are changing.

Parent Top Tip

Go for a winter walk in the park or woods and collect things to bring into school.

Speaking and Listening; Reading and Writing

We are learning about the sounds in words. What sounds can you hear in hat? Ask your child what sounds they can hear. Use crayons to try writing letters and words - but don't worry if they're a bit wobbly!

Parent Top Tip Children learn to read quicker when they read at home too. Speak and share books in your home language. Join the library.

Physical Development

We are learning to keep healthy with our food and exercise. We need to run skillfully and negotiate space successfully, adjusting speed or direction to avoid obstacles.

Parent Top Tip

Go on the monkey bars in the park and encourage your child to swing along. This is great for their shoulder muscles, to develop their strength to learn to write. *Help your child learn to put their shoes and socks on.*



Maths

We are learning to recite numbers one to ten in order. Begin to recognise numbers one to ten. Talk about tins and food packets.

Which is heavier? Which is lighter? Taller? Wider?

Parent Top Tip

Go shopping with your child and compare heavy and light items in the shop.



Expressive Arts and Design

We are learning to create simple representations of events, people and objects with different media. Sing familiar songs and experiment with colours and respond to different textures.

Listen to different types of music at home and talk with them about the instruments you can hear.
