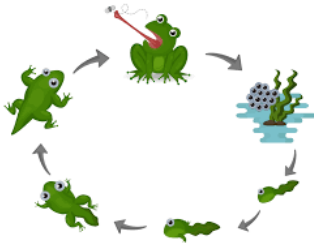
Parent Top Tip:
